

Course Description:

This course is designed for all health and social care staff working alongside clients who have epilepsy. This course follows the guidelines laid down by the Joint Epilepsy Council (JEC) and will increase awareness, alongside the skills, knowledge and confidence of your staff team.

Training packages can be tailored to meet the specific needs and concerns of your service.

Duration:

The session is delivered over a half day. Training times are normally 9.30-12.30 or 13.30-16.30. This course will be delivered over one day if it is required in conjunction with Rectal Diazepam *or* Buccal Midazolam administration training (9.30-16.30). It will be run over 1.5 days if required with Rectal Diazepam *and* Buccal Midazolam administration training.

Course content:

Epilepsy facts; Causes; Seizure Classification; Partial Seizures; Generalised Seizures; Seizure Management; Triggers and Precipitants; Anti-epileptic Medications; Status; Use of Rectal Diazepam/Buccal Midazolam; Contraindications; Cautions; Procedure for Administration and Ethical Issues; First Aid; Workbooks

Certification:

Delegates will receive a certificate of attendance on completing the course. Delegates will receive a certificate of confidence if also attending the administration of Rectal Diazepam and/or Buccal Midazolam session. Certificates will be valid for one year after which a refresher course will be required.

Numbers:

A maximum of 12 delegates can be accommodated on this course.

Codes of Practice; Definition; Incidence; Risk management; Care Planning; Current guidelines; Anatomy and Physiology of the Pancreas; Type I, Type II and Gestational diabetes; Treatment (including glucose monitoring, pharmacology and lifestyle interventions); Complications; Ketoacidosis; Hypo and Hyperglycaemia; First Aid
