

Course Description:

'Safeguarding the rights of others is the most noble and beautiful end of a human being' Kahlil Gibran (1883-1931)

This course is aimed at raising awareness of the importance of Safeguarding Vulnerable Adults. Delegates completing this course will be in a better position to implement their Company adult protection policy and have an increased awareness of the procedures they should follow. It is particularly relevant following the recent allegations of abuse exposed on Panorama (2011) which highlighted ineffective safeguarding systems and processes.

This session is intended for all health and social care workers in order to ensure care is delivered appropriately and effectively. It meets Common Induction Standard 5 (5.4.1; 5.4.2; 5.4.3) and Standard 6.

Duration:

This is a full day course. Times are normally 9.30-16.30

Course content:

Types of Abuse; What is a vulnerable Adult? Who is an Abuser? Recognising Abuse; Guidelines for dealing with Abuse; Dealing with Disclosure; Reporting Procedures; Safeguarding Vulnerable Groups Act 2006
